25th Anniversary of the United Nations.

The 24th October 1970 marked the twenty fifth anniversary of the doming into force of the United Nations Charter whose main purpose is to maintain international peace. It carries out this task in three ways through discussion, enunciation and action. Malta took her place as the 114th member on the 1st December 1964, and her main interest has been the reservation of the seabed for peaceful purposes and the first convention "Pacem In Maribus Convocation" was held in Malta on the 28th June to 3rd July 1970.

On the 30th September 1970 Malta issued a set of three stamps to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the United Nations, designed by Joseph Casha, following a public competition. These stamps depict peace,

justice and progress.





1989 Anniversaries and Commemorations

On the 17 October 1989 Malta issued a set of Five stamps to commemorate the 20th Anniversary of United Nations Declaration on Social Progress and four other commemorations,

The stamps were designed by Louis Gasha after winning a public competition organised by the Malta Lost. 19 years earlier, his brother also won a public competition to design United Nations commemorative stamps. Louis was an artist working with shapes and colours and like his brother brought a freshness to Maltese stamps.

These were the only stamps he designed.












"Achievement of Maltese Art"
